The parties agree that the certifier must be active in both performing certifications on an international basis and to follow and improve the individual qualifications on areas covered in the seven International criteria for Safe Communities.

Re-application must be performed no later than after three years. The applicant accepts to for future accreditation provide a list of certified communities as well as proof of

- Effective communication (written and oral) skills.
- In depth knowledge of the criteria and process required for International Safe Community accreditation.
- Cultural sensitivity and awareness.
- Understanding of community development.
- Good understanding of injury data, evaluation and effective prevention strategies.

The Accredited Certifier agrees on only performing certifications in other countries than the own.

He/ She also agrees on following the recommended established ethical rules and stick to recommended fees in charging the communities for the work performed.

He/ She also agrees on using the new internet-based system for certifications as well as providing the information needed for the cv- presentation on the WHOCCCSP- homepage.
