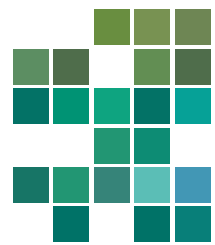

Mode of Presentations

Presentations may be made in one of the following modes:

- Oral Paper Presentation
- Poster Presentation – including dedicated poster viewing session with author on-site

Abstract Submission instruction guidelines

Abstracts must be no more than 400 words and follow the outline below:

OPTION A: Research

- Background
- Aims
- Methods
- Results
- Discussion and conclusions

OPTION B: Policy and Practice

- Context
- Objectives
- Key messages
- Discussion and conclusions

Abstract Assessment Process

- Abstracts will be reviewed by the Scientific Program Committee
- Acceptance of an abstract will be based on the below assessment criteria
- Preference may be given to only selecting one abstract per author for the conference program. Authors who submit multiple abstracts will need to nominate which of their abstracts should receive highest preference
- The Committee's decision is final
- Authors will be notified of their abstract results by Friday 7 June 2013.

Abstract Assessment Criteria

The criteria for evaluating abstracts includes, but is not limited to, the following:

- Contains new information
- Clarity of abstract
- Relevance to practice or policy/scientific merit
- Contribution to the theme/s of the conference
- Interest to the audience.

Presenter Terms and Conditions

- Accepted presenters must register and pay for the conference by Friday 30 August 2013 or their presentation will be removed from program.
- Accepted abstracts for both oral and poster presentations will be included in a printed conference proceedings book and will be made available online.
- Full papers are not requested or required at any stage.
- Presentation slides are requested in advance, with the date for submission to be advised by the conference coordinator, Loaded Communications, on advice of acceptance.
- Presentation slides may be provided online after the event subject to author consent.
