

when they met daily household problems like electrical short circuit, water supply problems, the residents employ a number of informal workers to solve the problems as they are cheap and easily accessible.



However the unskilled maintenances cause several problems in the later phase. To solve the electric, water and household problems, Youth Park safe Community has established the first community estate service agency in the city “Service centre for people in Youth Park”. The service centre is opened 24 hours 7 days a week with a staggering success rate of 100 percent.

Media Promotion: Youth park safe Community actively promote safe community activities in different media channels like national and local dailies.

Collaborations: Youth Park leads several national and international collaborations. Core members of Youth Park Safe Community team frequently attend different Safe Communities activities around the world. At the same time delegates from Africa, Asia, Europe, Australia visit Youth Park to share knowledge and enhance mutual experience (so far greeted 196 teams and 960 persons). With the Safe Community activities, Prof. Leif Svanström said: “My expectation is that the Youth Park Community Safe community program shall serve as catalyst for other communities in Mainland China even the whole Asia.”

“Let’s Agree” Project:

The campaign DOMLUVME SE! (Let’s agree!) is a variation of the Designated Driver concept targeted at drinking and driving among young people. Teams of the project operated during concerts of the famous Czech rock groups CHINASKI, DIVOKEJ BILL, TŘI SESTRY and WANSTOVY VJECY. The frontmen of the bands send a clear message against drinking and driving to the visitors of their concerts and special promotional teams of hostesses offer the chance to be voluntary breathalyses. If a controlled person is clearly sober, he or she is given a small gift, e.g. t-shirt. The campaign is one of the main activities of the Czech Ministry of Transport, Road Safety Department (BESIP) and it is supported by FORUM PSR (Responsible Spirits Producers) and the Responsible Brewers Initiative. The technical support provides the agency Euronet.CZ.

The campaign has been covered by the President of the Upper Chamber of the Czech Parliament (the Senate) Mr Premysl Sobotka.

A new resource for preventing falls among elderly people in the EU

The first document, 'Feasibility of large scale interventions for preventing falls among older people in the European Union', is a technical report providing key information on the methods and results of four studies conducted during the APOLLO Work Package 4 project. In addition this report also includes a case study of two implementations of the same intervention in two EU countries. The second document, published in November 2008, presents the results of the four studies in the form of a 'A guide for implementers of interventions to prevent falls in community dwelling older people'. Finally, a third document, 'Prevention of falls in older people: Time to act', provides recommendations for promoting the prevention of falls in community-dwelling older people. It covers areas such as what works in preventing falls, facilitating and monitoring the success of the proposed intervention fall prevention and the promotion of health and mental well-being in older people.

These documents have been produced by APOLLO Work Package 4, 'Development and assessment of strategic materials for implementation of recommendations for preventing falls among elderly people in the EU'. The main aim of this project was to fill gaps in knowledge on specific aspects that hinder the implementation of large scale interventions for the prevention of falls in older people. These documents provide information which can be used by public health researches, implementers of interventions for the prevention of falls and parties involved in the design of national or local action plans in the EU in the evaluation of the feasibility of large scale interventions in the EU.
