Mayor and the community of Peñaflor lead the First Regional Conference on Safe Communities of the Americas

The First Regional Conference on Safe Communities of the Americas took place from April 6th to 8th in Peñaflor, Chile. There were authorities from whole Peñaflor and the Metropolitan region as well as attendees from diverse nations, close to 800 people attending the lectures and more than 10.000 people among schools-students and representatives from communitarian organizations visited the exhibition hall.

Peñaflor's Mayor Manuel Fuentes Rosales at the closing ceremony made an announcement about the main achievements of the Conference. Among them, it was reached co-operation agreements with representatives from Serbia, Colombia, Peru, United States, Sweden, Argentina and South Korea regarding with civilian protection, education and health promotion. This was recognition for the work that the community has been doing.

The Mayor of Peñaflor receives a lot of words of recognition for him and his team work, from the international visitors. All of them expressed special thanks and appreciation to all those who have contributed to the success of the Conference. The participation of the international speakers enriched the sharing of experiences about injury and violence prevention in the frame of Safe Communities.

44 speakers were part of the Conference that offered specialized lectures related with Disaster Prevention and Risk Management. The opening presentation was Svanström, Chair Karolinska Institute; Mirjana Milanpresiding by Professor Leif Svanström, leader of Safe Communities Movement in damage and Promotion of Safety at Serbia; Mayor of the world. During his talk emphasized that "All human beings have an equal right to health and safety and all of us should struggle to get that, looking for allied to reach this goal. The Mayor Manuel Fuentes has demonstrated that this is a important issue for his administration and it is the reason why Peñaflor has become a leader of the movement in Latin America."

One of the issues that most caught the attendees' attention was the lecture of Alejandro Pino, manager of the IV Regional Association of Security from Chile about "The 33 miners' rescue".

Peñaflor through its communitarian committee for Emergency showed up programs as: Neighbor Care, Home Doctor and Safe Schools Plan.

2011 Travelling Seminar & Conference in Taiwan

During April 9-11, 2011, a Travelling Seminar with the theme of "Safe community programs suiting local conditions" was held in Taiwan. In a 3-day tour, Participants from America, China, Japan, Korea, Thailand and community representatives from different region of Taiwan joined together and visited 4 designated international safe communities: Fengbin (91st), Shoufeng (147th), Jinhwa (215th) and Wenshan (218th). Then, they all attended "2011 Conference on Safe Community Development in Taiwan" held in Taipei on April 12.



Travelling Seminar, April 9-11

Day 1: The journey began with taking the train from Taipei to Hualien County where Fengbin and Shoufeng townships are located. During the 3 hours railing, the participants were able to get acquainted and enjoyed the beautiful east coastline of Taiwan. Then, we took a bus to Farglory Hotel for lunch. After a brief introduction to the safety promotion programs of the two communities, the group were led to Siouguluan River, a famous place for rafting, to see rafts and related equipments that were improved for promoting safety of rafting. The boat company patented several invention items since they joined Fengbin SC program. Shore fishing is another popular water activity in Fengbin, but few anglers would wear a life jacket. The Fengbin SC water safety working group teams up with coast guard to patrol along the coast and persuades the anglers to wear life jacket to ensure their safety.

Next visit site was the well-known Green Tunnel in Shoufeng. The Tunnel was built for stopping trucks go through the community and keeping residents a safe way to home.

The Shoufeng SC also plant trees along country roads to narrow the width of the road for reducing motor vehicles' speed and enhancing pedestrians and bicyclists' safety.

Day 2: Back to Taipai, the visit focused on safety promotion programs that integrated with leisure and cultural activities in Wenshan district of Taipei City. The Taipei Zoo provides a safe and comfortable environment for tourists, and serves as a transmission media of safety knowledge. The Chih-Nan Temple, the oldest temple in Wenshan District, designed the incense burner in the way that can prevent burn injury. In addition, a traditional amulet with safety message inside is given to the worshiper after praying.

Day 3: We took High Speed Rail to Tainan to visit Jinhwa SC. Tight relationship among residents and complete linkage of resources impressed the visitors very much. Children can be good partners in safety education whereas the elderly and disabled can get immediate help when there is a need.

2011 Conference on Safe Community Development in Taiwan, April 12

After the 3-day travelling seminar, a conference on SC development and adolescent safety promotion was held in Taipei. Dr. Shu-Ti Chiou, Director of Bureau of Health Promotion, Dept. of Health, welcomed all guests in person and applauded attendants herein for their achievements on safety promotion. Vosskuhler, Chairman of ISS, WHO CC CSP, provided an effective intervention on banishing bullying. Representatives from Shoufeng ISC, Yen-

Ping ISS and Nangang ISC also shared their practical experiences on preventing bullying with the audience.

Safe Communities in Skaraborg (Mariestad, Töreboda, Skövde, Falköping and Lidköping) welcome You to join a Travelling Seminar in connection to *the 20th International Safe Community Conference* in Falun, Sweden.
