A wonderful learning trip in five safe communities in Skaraborg, Sweden

From 2nd to 5th of September we, fifteen delegates from Japan, Korea, China, Sweden and Czechoslovakia, participated the travelling seminar which was in conjunction with the 20th International Safe Community Conference. Five designated safe communities in Skaraborg, Sweden jointly hosted this event. The five communities are Mariestad, Töreboda, Skövde, Falköping and Lidköping and among them Lidköping was the ever first designated safe community in the world.

With the presentation of A Short Description Of Working With Safe Community In Skaraborg For 20 Years presented by Professor Robert Ekman the travelling seminar started. This presentation described the impact of a community-based programme in Western Sweden that used multiple prevention strategies. From over 30 years recorded injury data from national and regional sources strong evidence was shown that safe community is a very effective strategy and platform in terms of injury prevention and safety promotion. More presentations were given in the following days. In Mariestad' they introduced their safe community work especially the Marine and Ice safety. Different sports clubs has their own way and strategy to promote safety sports. In Töreboda they presented their work on child safety. They created many opportunities and chances to involve kids and their parents into safety activities. In Skövde the local work with youth safety was paid a lot attention. They used the internet to establish a close relationship with youngsters and interact with youngster through their webpage. In Lidköping they presented many cases about traffic injury and they demonstrated how they have influenced the decision maker to adjust the related law or regulation. In Falköping they presented their suicide prevention project and youth fire brigade project. They worked together with school to identify those so called problem-making students to teach them safety knowledge and skills and encourage them to live a safety life and to serve the society. During the travelling seminar we visited many programme sites as well including the locking operation in Mariestad, the family center and the child safety day in Töreboda, the safety and health festival in Skövde, the elderly house in Falköping, and traffic safety in Lidköping.

A special event was held in the last day of travelling seminar. Källby Gård School, the first designated (November 24, 2003) international safe school in the world got re-designated in 6th of September 2011. The mayor of the city, Professor Nam-soo Park from Korea and Professor Shu-mei Wang from China signed on the agreement. Through the presentation and on-site visit we can see their great achievements since the launching of safe school programme in 1994.

Finally we would like to express our sincere thanks to those five communities again. We learned a lot from their rich experiences in injury prevention and safety promotion! We enjoyed a lot with the beautiful landscape! We communicated a lot with so nice local people! Many thanks go to Mariestad, Töreboda, Skövde, Falköping and Lidköping once more.

Austria during November 2011. These are based on indicators developed for Safe Children Communities about five years ago. During the Falun Conference, Safe Kids Worldwide set out its plans for the development of a strong collaboration with Safe Communities to help in the creation of safer communities for children, especially in the low income countries of the world. This can occur within existing or new Safe Communities and the existing designation structures, and also through the designation of communities as Safe Children Communities.

Safe Kids Worldwide is a network of 20 member country organisations dedicated to reducing the level and severity of unintentional injury to children. These members span the conti-
